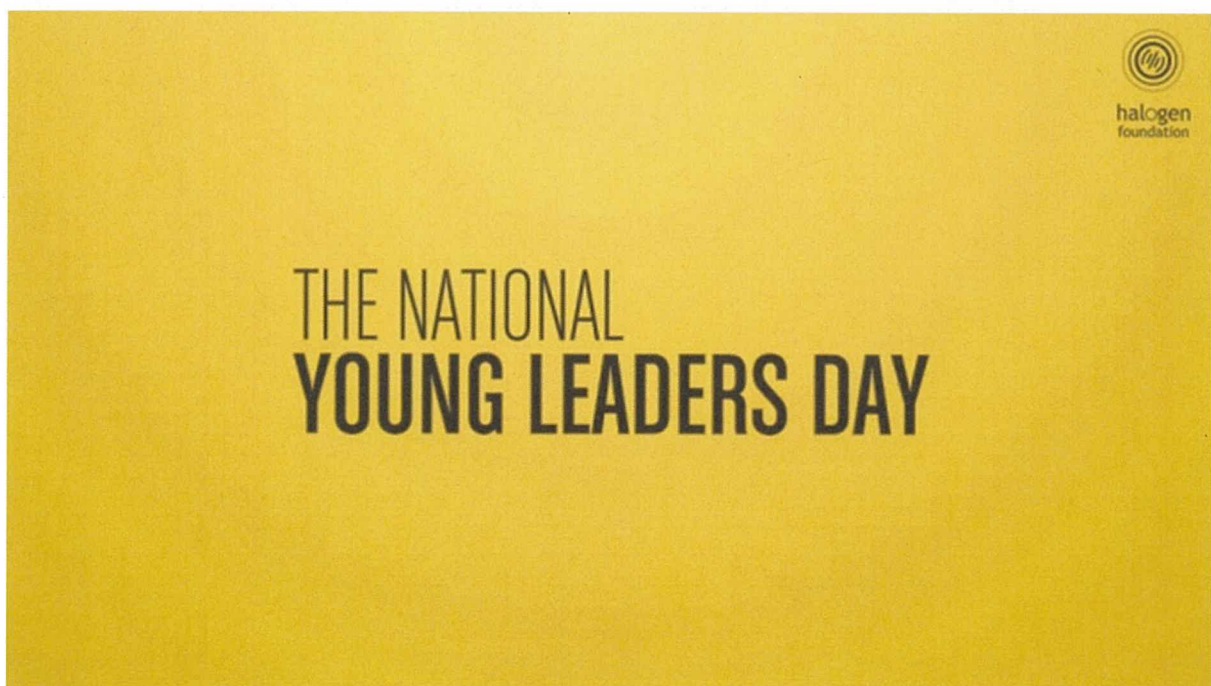

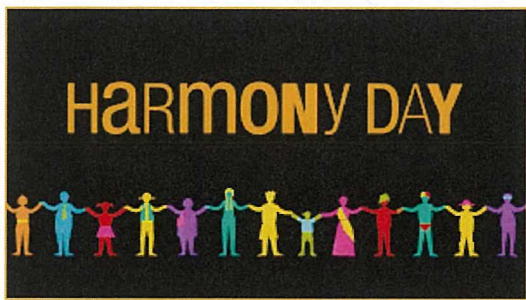
Congratulations to Emily Lake who was selected for the team. She will travel to Albury on the 2nd April 2019.

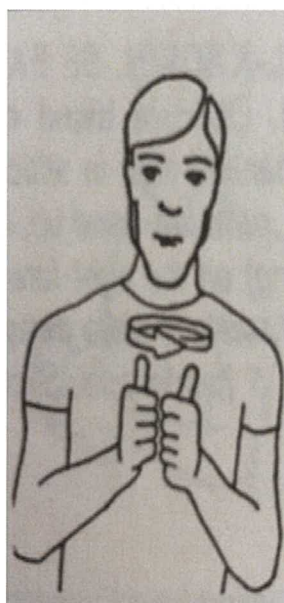


Have you downloaded the School Stream app yet? Passcode is 1777.
