NAPLAN

Last week we conducted the NAPLAN tests for the Year 3 and Year 5 students. All students who participated in these events behaved beautifully and tried their best. Once we get the results we will pass them onto the parents and/or carers. Please remember that these are only one type of assessment that we use to inform teaching and learning practices. Teacher judgements are formed by using a number of tests. The judgement will then be reflected in your child's report which comes out later this term.

Reconciliation Week Activities

May 27 – May 31 is Reconciliation Week. As a school we will be celebrating this in a variety of ways. Firstly, we are asking all students in Year 5 and Year 6 to participate in the annual Reconciliation Walk on Monday, May 27 from 9.30am – 11.30am. This walk will take place from the Njernda Medical Centre and finish at the Aquatic Reserve. As we promote inclusion here at Moama Public School we wish for all of these students to attend the event.

Later on in the week we are unveiling a mural created by Neva Atkinson. The mural will be entitled "*The Tree of Knowledge*". 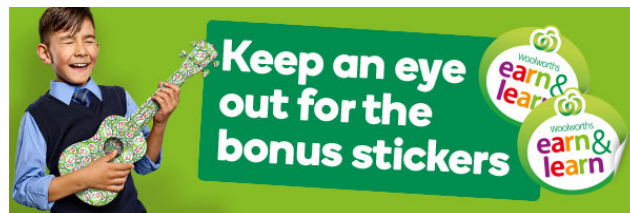
