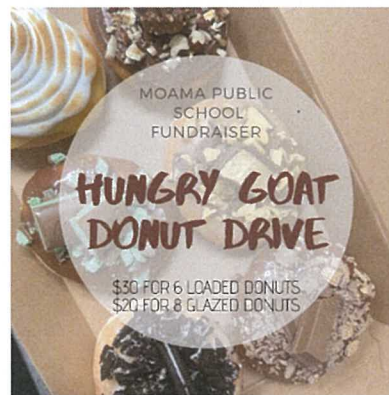

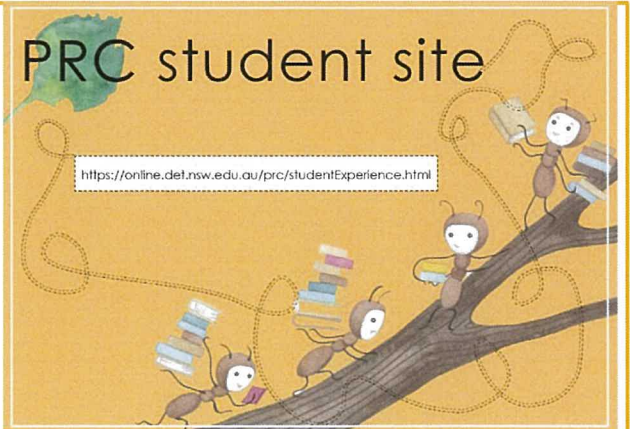
2019 NSW PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

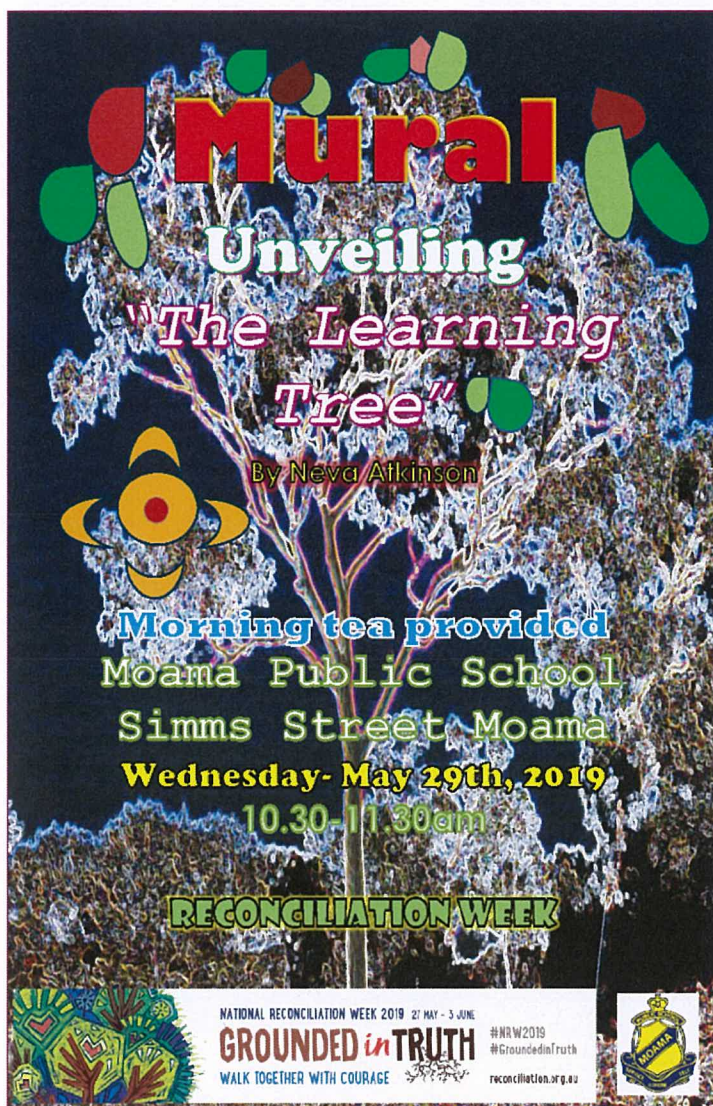
