It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing but it gives us a snapshot of your child's learning capabilities at this particular point in time. The assessment is an important tool for classroom teachers as they measure student progress and use this data to create teaching and learning programs for the student's point of need.

Parenting Tips...

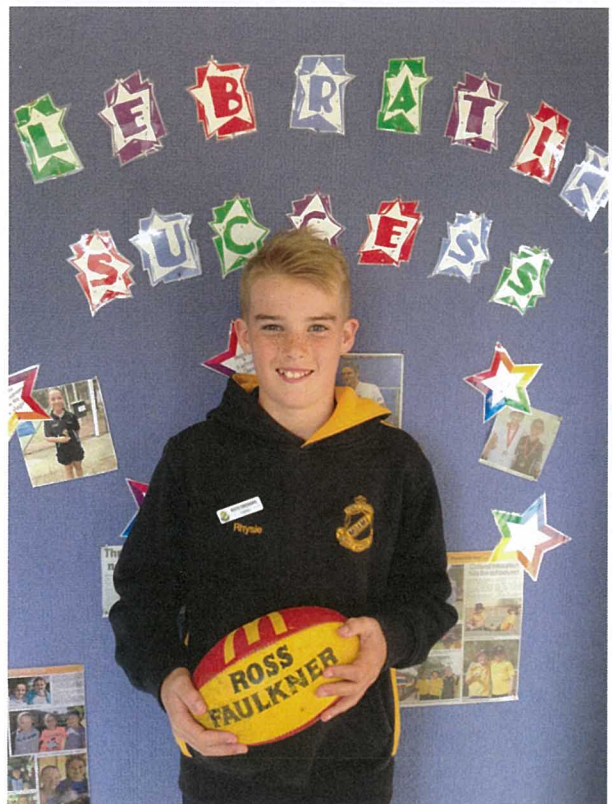

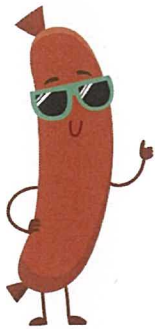
