Reconciliation Week Mural Unveiling

Last Wednesday was a very special day for the Moama Public School. We unveiled an absolutely magnificent mural created by Neva Atkinson from Akoriginal Art & Craft. The mural, titled *"The Learning Tree"* has a very special meaning. The hands in the rivers belong to the staff – representing the flow of knowledge, whilst the hands in the tree belong to the Indigenous students and the non-Indigenous students have their names on the leaves. This is a piece of art that celebrates Inclusion which is an integral part of our school culture.



Instructional Rounds

Last Tuesday members of staff visited two schools in Deniliquin (Deniliquin North and Deniliquin South) to observe teaching and learning in a different context. During this time the staff picked up some knowledge which they will then implement back at our school. Professional learning such as this gives our staff an opportunity to grow as teachers. K-2 Twisted Science

Last Tuesday students in K-2 were very lucky to receive a special visit from Claire from Twisted Science to conduct a hands-on workshop on “Chemical Reactions”. This activity complements the current materials and chemical science unit that the infants are studying this term.

“We made experiments and blew bubbles and made the colours turn back to white. We put syringes in water and had to squirt it into the container. Claire made a fire with glycerine in a patty pan. I liked it!” **Jye KC**

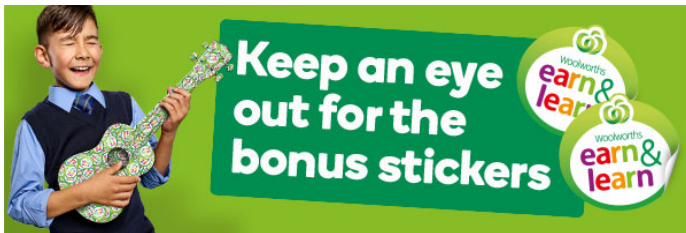
“I liked the part where we had to mix up all the chemicals in the water and I learnt something new about mixing chemicals”. **Meylah 2C**

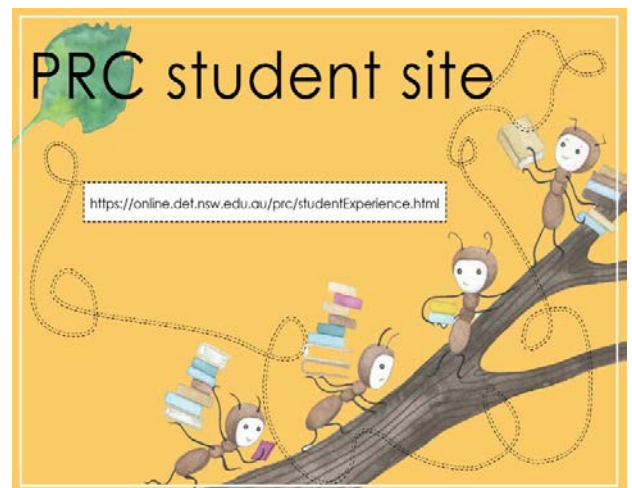
