School tours outside of this time are welcome and will provide you with a wonderful opportunity to see our students and teachers in action.



Are you ready for winter? Cooler weather is just around the corner, so this is a great opportunity to catch up with your local NSW Fire and Rescue Firefighters and learn all about keeping your family fire safe during the cooler months.

To ensure that your family is safe this winter we would like to educate your family and the community about fire prevention and safety, our key message this year is "Be Fire Safe". Fire and Rescue NSW will be hosting its annual Open Day on **Saturday 11th May 2024** between 10:00am and 2:00pm. This will give you an opportunity to engage with your local Fire and Rescue NSW station.

You and your family are invited to head down to your local fire station for home fire safety tips, activities and demonstrations and you will also have the opportunity to chat with firefighters to learn more about their everyday role and type of fires and rescue emergencies they attend.

ANZAC Caramel Slice



Preheat oven to 180C and prepare a lamington or slice tin with a sheet of baking paper.

Base:

- 225gm softened butter
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla essence

In a large bowl, beat the above ingredients until light and fluffy. Add in the following ingredients :

- 2 cups plain flour
- 1 cup rolled quick oats
- 1/2 cup dessicated coconut
- 1 tblsp golden syrup.

Mix until well combined. You might like to use clean hands to blend it all. Place 3/4 of this base mix into the slice tin spreading evenly.

Caramel topping:

- 1 tin of condensed milk
- 50 gm butter
- 3 tblsp golden syrup

Heat these ingredients in a saucepan until the butter is melted, stirring all the time being careful not to burn. Remove from stove when a lovely caramel colour.

Pour the caramel topping over the base mix. Sprinkle the remaining base mix over the top. Bake for around 30-35 minutes.

Optional: Drizzle melted chocolate over the top for a real caramel slice look.
